Proposals submitted after Experimental Biology, between <u>April 26-May 10</u>, will be presented and reviewed by members of the ILCM and guests attending the ILCM meeting at the ESM-EVBO meeting, <u>May 29-June 1</u> in Geneva, Switzerland. In Geneva a final decision will be made by the ILCM for the site of the 2022 World Congress for Microcirculation.

I urge all of you to distribute this call to your respective society leadership and membership. This is important in order to insure the broadest possible exposure to this call and provide interested parties with ample opportunity to prepare a proposal.
